COVID-19 and Hearing

A year in, the research continues to show that infection with COVID-19 can lead to worsened hearing and/or tinnitus. Researchers suggest that causes could be blood clots, autoimmune response, or neural infections but admit that more rigorous testing is needed. These results were mostly obtained via self-reported questionnaires.

We're proud to introduce our newest offering: Tinnitus Treatment. Tinnitus, pronounced (TIN-uh-tus) or (tin-NY-tus) is a common problem in which people hear noises inside their head (ringing, clicking, buzzing) that are not caused by an outside source. Tinnitus is frequently associated with hearing loss but can also exist when hearing is normal. For many people, it's an easy-to-ignore nuisance but there are others for whom tinnitus is a major concern.

Our protocol includes a comprehensive tinnitus assessment, a discussion of treatment options and appointments as needed for the treatment that is chosen. Some testing and treatment may be covered through insurance, and some will be an out-of-pocket expense.

Tinnitus treatment will be scheduled with Dr. Sarah Moore, who holds a Certificate in Tinnitus Management from the American Board of Audiology, and can be scheduled in either our Brattleboro or our Swanzey office. We are excited to be able to help this underserved population!

Newer, smarter hearing aids!

Hearing aid technology continues to grow by leaps and bounds. Oticon just introduced their newest model, More. More is the first hearing aid with a "deep neural network" or DNN. This hearing aid has been trained to recognize important sounds like a human brain does; their research shows that people using this system understand more speech with less effort. The More is currently only available in a rechargeable style.

 If your hearing changes suddenly, it is considered a medical **emergency** that absolutely has treatment options (see our blog at brattleborohearing.com for additional information).
Cochlear implants, when needed, are almost universally covered by insurance.
