

A Living Slice of Cochlea? (It's a big deal)

A. James Hudspeth and his team in the Laboratory of Sensory Neuroscience at The Rockefeller University succeeded at something that's eluded researchers for decades: the ability to keep a tiny sliver of the cochlea alive and functional outside of the body. Their new device allowed them to capture and observe the cochlea's remarkable auditory powers, including exceptional sensitivity, sharp frequency tuning, and the ability to encode a broad range of sound intensities. This is expected to help with our understanding of hearing, and to target future therapies for improving it!

Cochlear Implants!

As technology continues to update rapidly, more people with hearing loss are considered good candidates for cochlear implants, a medical and audiological procedure that restores electrical connection between the inner ear and the brain. Brattleboro Hearing Center is proud to announce that we have recently become part of the Cochlear Provider Network.

Cochlear implants are largely covered by health insurance, including Medicare, as long as they are deemed "medically necessary." Determining this involves a standard audiological evaluation, followed by specific testing with properly fit hearing aids. If we determine that a patient is an audiological candidate, they would then meet with a surgeon (Springfield, MA or Worcester, MA) for the medical portion of the evaluation.

Activation and ongoing maintenance will be done in our Brattleboro and Swanzey offices!

We're delighted to be able to offer this expanded service to our patients (when appropriate!).
